To make a specialized stroke, take scissors to any brush (preferably an old one) and cut an edge that suits you.

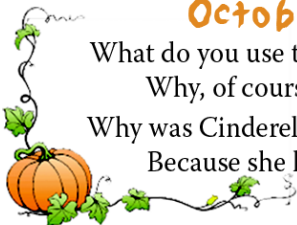
